*The average level of indoor air pollution in Grant County workplaces that allow smoking (PM2.5 = 68.2 µg/m3) is 2 times higher than the National Ambient Air Quality Outdoor Standard (PM2.5 = 36 µg/m3). Members of FFLAG and Grant County Champions measured air quality in 5 Grant County workplaces that allow smoking.
