community collaboration

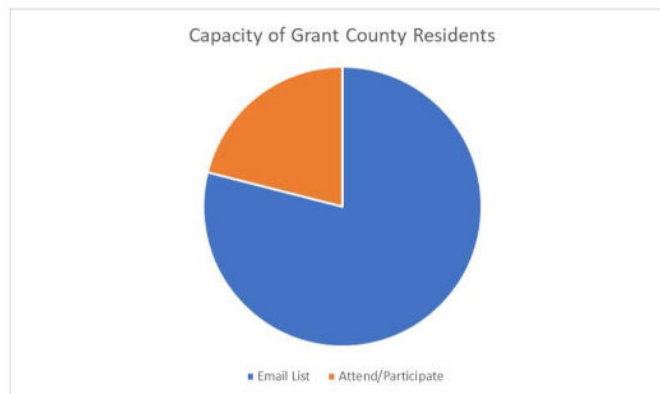
How would we be impacted personally/professionally if the coalition went away?

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Should coalition continue to exist after DFC funding and why? Yes: 9, No: 0

Youth need to know people outside of their daily interactions are concerned about them, There's evidence we've made a difference, Coalition holds community together, Our current community would be very different if coalition was not created, Coalitions 'trickled down' and help initiatives for regional/state agencies, Coalition benefits our most important population - youth, If the coalition didn't exist, it would minimize or erase current resources, There's value in coalition's efforts **BUTs:** District will not pay for position, Opportunity to merge (FFLAG) but still keep branding (county board of health), regardless of coalition connections would continue to exist

What role will you play professional or personally in making our continued existence a reality?

Technical assistance-resources- connect to state wide initiative and school based programs

Continue to advocate for the coalition, help with/promote programs to build knowledge of what the coalition is doing. - share coalition information/success with "own" group

Be able to participate in community events to educate the community on resources that are available to the citizens. Help make them more robust, add substance/information

Collaborate with Regional Partners in sharing up to date prevention practices- continued community engagement/connection
