## **Monthly Reports**

### Substance Update

- St. Elizabeth will not be providing written recommendation/certification for medical marijuana;
   coalition unsure of how/where people will seek a recommendation/certification for medical marijuana outside of St. Elizabeth
  - Legislation requires established provider/patient relationship
  - Legislation prohibits telehealth visits to obtain recommendation/certification
- Election Day Ballot vote is for jurisdiction of Fiscal Court (unincorporated areas, outside of city limits) and the City of Corinth as they have not yet made an official decision



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- Majority Vote Yes = medical marijuana business/industry will be allowed to operate in unincorporated areas, outside of city limits and in City of Corinth
  - If City of Corinth does not want to allow business, they will have to opt out
- Majority Vote No = medical marijuana business/industry will not be allowed to operate in unincorporated areas, outside of city limits
  - If City of Corinth wants to allow, they will have to opt back in
- A license was awarded for a Tier 2 Cultivator in Grant Co.
  - Majority Vote Yes = This cultivator could operate in unincorporated areas or City of Corinth (unless they opt out)
  - Majority Vote No = This cultivator will be offered to operate from another area that has allowed the operation of business/industry.
  - The only "NKY" Counties that received licenses for cultivators/processors were Grant and Bracken.
    - Lottery for dispensary license will be held 11/25
  - The primary distinction between tiers for cultivators is the square footage of indoor growth area allowed. Tier 2 = 10,000 square feet. More info on cultivators <a href="here">here</a>.

### Coordinator's Report

- Collaborated with 7 community agencies to help Hispanic community (82 peopl) connect to services and resources
- o 100 bags distributed at "Tobacco Free" Tailgate (NKY Health Dept. collaboration)
- Red Ribbon Week Peer to Peer Vape Prevention Presentations by high school students impacted
   230 students (5th grade)
- Between Williamstown and Grant Co. Schools, 40 students attended the NKY Regional Youth Summit
- From Grant Co. Schools, approximately 743 students completed KIP Survey and results will be in/around March 2025.
  - 2024 KIP Survey will serve as pre-legalization data. When the KIP Survey is completed in 2026, it will be with the emphasis that medical marijuana became effective in 2025.

### Budget Overview

- o Budget Remaining: \$112,794.42
- o In-Kind Match Met: 25.15% already in the FIRST MONTH of the Fiscal Year!!!
- Looking for an opportunity to use Interact for Health event sponsorship funding for mocktails (samples, recipes, prevention info for youth/pregnant women/people in recovery) ideally before/around Thanksgiving, New Years, July 4.

### **Old Business:**

Continued Grant Application Discussion



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- Children of Parents in Recovery is not a recognized 'disparate' population
  - There is not a designated agency that tracks these individuals/families; there is no data to clearly identify the number or percentage of the general population affected
  - A focus in this area blurs public perception of Champions as prevention organization and creates mission drift into treatment/recovery which we do not have the experience, expertise, and capacity to address
- Children in Foster Care due to substance use can still be served as a subset of Kinship Care (one
  of our current target populations)
- 4 R's Activity: Shared Risk, Shared Responsibility, Shared Resources, Shared Reward
